Dear Sons Squadron,

As another year comes to a successful close, I would like to update everyone with upcoming events. We are still in the process of coming into compliance with our post supervisory committee. We are working with them and following the spirit of the rules while we tie up the final, official task of adding them to our accounts to be in full compliance. This has been a goal over the last few months and I am happy to report we are finally getting it accomplished. Our dinners are still going well and our kitchen crew is always trying to come up with additional specials to help keep things interesting. Recently, I went to a District 8 meeting hosted by American Legion Post 112 as well as a District 8 whirlwind. We were able to have a quorum and voted on a couple of resolutions at the district level. One was to approve funding for a renewal reward program (Resolution 1-25). This program is intended to reward squadrons for 100% renewal with drawings of eligible squadrons on October 1st and December 31st. I will spare the specifics as I do not want to misquote them here. Additionally, there was a resolution that also passed unanimously to approve funding to pay the dues to national for all members with 50+ continuous years in recognition of them. This does affect the squadron a bit but, considering how few of those members there are, is considered fairly negligible (Resolution 1-25).

We do have elections upcoming. We were successfully able to make nominations for the new board with only a couple of vacancies. Swearing in will take place in June, as per usual, with post supervisory committee approval (part of the new compliance element). Membership: We have achieved 102%! All we need now is our Day of Service project on May 3rd to qualify for All American! If you are an annual member, please help us by paying your dues now! You will still get 12 months of additional paid membership, but it helps us immensely by knowing how many more we need to recruit yet this year. You can pay your dues online at www.vfw.org, call me to meet with you to pick them up, or mail your dues (\$40) to me (8510 Monroe St, Ralston, NE 68127). **Checks should be made payable to VFW Post 2704.** You can also call me (402.618.2731) with your credit/debit card information or to have me stop by your home. **VFW Nebraska still has some \$50 life incentives! Our Post set aside \$2.5K for 50 ea. \$50 incentives again this membership year – that's \$100 off the price of a life membership! This is a really big deal – as an example, if you are Under 30, the outright cost of a life membership is \$410. You could have a life membership for only \$310 instead of \$410 (I'm in my 70s and the American**

Legion now want \$1025 for me!). But if you are or will turn 81 this year, your cost is \$170-100 for only \$70! If interested, please contact me as the money for life incentive will go fast!

Community Activities: We continue to lead bingo at the Eastern Nebraska Veterans Home in Bellevue each month and average 20-25 players each time. We now pay \$1 per game for 24 games and \$4 each for 2 blackout games. We also purchase 100 lbs. of potatoes each month for New Visions Homeless Veterans Shelter.
